Hanging & Dressing Instructions



how to...

hang and dress your curtains...

In your box you will find your curtains, which have been made to the exact measurements you ordered. Your curtains have been dressed into their pleats / waves and tied in place so that they are ready to hang. Do not remove the ties until your curtains are hanging on your pole / track.

See below for hanging curtains on both tracks and poles, and different heading types.

Hanging Eyelet Curtains on a Pole

Eyelet curtains are designed to be used on a pole only. Our eyelet curtains will fit on a pole up to 35mm diameter. If you have a pair of curtains they will be labelled with a L or R to indicate which curtain is the Left and which is the Right.



Step 1: Take the pole length off the brackets on the wall if already fitted.

Step 2: Looking at the pole in front of you, remove the Right finial from your curtain pole.

Step 3: Thread the curtains onto the pole through the eyelets of your curtain. Start with the Left curtain, followed by the Right curtain.

Step 4: Fit the Right finial back on the pole.

Step 5: Offer the pole (with curtains on) up to the brackets (already fitted to the wall above the window), positioning the last outside eyelet between the bracket and the finial. This holds the outer edge of the curtain in place, preventing the curtain sliding all the way across the window.

Step 6: When the pole is cupped in the brackets, ensure it is positioned central to the outside brackets, and then tighten the grub screw on the brackets to hold the pole firmly in place.

Step 7: See the guidance on how to dress your curtains.

Hanging Pleated Curtains on a Pole

Double and Triple Pinch Pleat curtains can be hung on a pole that has rings.

If you have a pair of curtains they will be labelled with a L or R to indicate which curtain is the Left and which is the Right.

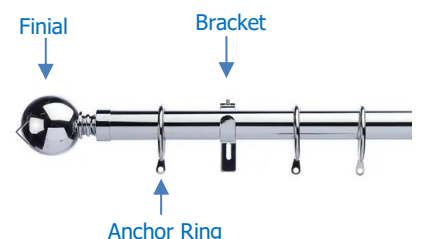
Step 1: Your curtain pole should be fitted to the wall.

Step 2: Count the number of hooks that are in the heading of your curtain/s; you need to ensure you have the same number of rings on your pole. There should be one ring that sits between the finial of your pole and the bracket, at either end – this is the anchor ring which stops your curtain pulling all the way across the pole.

Step 3: Starting at the left of your pole, hook the very left hook of your Left curtain onto the Anchor Ring. Working along the curtain to the right, hook each curtain hook into the next ring. Repeat this for the Right curtain.

Tip: Drape the curtain over your shoulder or forearm to support the weight.

Step 4: See the guidance on how to dress your curtains.



Hanging Pleated and Wave Curtains on a Track

Double and Triple Pinch Pleat curtains can be hung on curtain tracks with standard gliders. Wave heading curtains must be hung on a specific track that has specially designed gliders to hold the desired wave effect when drawn.

Step 1: Your curtain track should be fitted to the wall.

Step 2: Count the number of hooks that are in the heading of your curtain/s; you need to ensure you have the same number of gliders on your track.

Step 3: Starting at the left of your track, hook the very left hook of your Left curtain onto the glider which is fixed to the end cap of the track. Working along the curtain to the right, hook each curtain hook into the next glider along. Repeat this for the Right curtain.

Tip: Drape the curtain over your shoulder or forearm to support the weight.

Step 4: See the guidance on how to dress your curtains.



Dressing your Curtains

Step 1: Your curtains will have been delivered dressed and loosely tied into their pleats. Hang them with the ties still in place.

Step 2: Once your curtains are hung, starting from the outside edge, work from the top downwards, run your hands firmly down the length of each fold. If you have one hand working from the front of the curtain and the other hand behind the curtain on the lining side, you can push the folds into place from the front and back. Skip over the ties.

Step 3: Keep your curtains tied in the stacked position for 2-3 days. This will 'train' your curtains to natural fall into their pleats.

Care and maintenance of your Curtains

We take immense pride in our packaging to ensure you receive your curtains just perfectly. However, all fabrics can be prone to slight creasing. Once your curtains are installed, and they settle in their environment, any creases should naturally drop out over a couple of weeks.

To keep your curtains looking fresh and clean we recommend they should be dusted monthly to prevent dust and dirt settling on the surface. Draw your curtains fully closed, and using a vacuum with a hose / soft brush attachment, lightly vacuum the fabric.

We would recommend that advice re dry cleaning be taken from a dry-cleaning expert, as the main fabric and lining may not be suitable.



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
